Tegan Case

After graduating from the University of Southern Queensland with a Bachelor of Commerce / Bachelor of Business (with Distinction) majoring in Finance, Economics and Supply Chain Management and receiving a number of awards for academic excellence, Tegan Case joined Woodside Energy as part of their Commercial Graduate Program.

During this time she realised that she wanted to focus her career development on Logistics, as it would allow her to combine her passion for operations with her desire to drive long-term sustainable commercial outcomes.

In March 2013 Tegan then joined Shell Australia's Logistics Department in order for a three year Logistics Development Programme. She then became a Logistics Resource Scheduler, was promoted within 18 months to the Logistics Planning and Strategy Lead; a position usually reserved for someone with ten years' experience.
